

Idiom: to pay through the nose

Meaning: to pay too much

Example: If you want to have a good car you have to pay through the nose for it!

to play ball


Meaning: to agree to do something in the way someone wants you to

Example: "The school year was so tiring that I need holidays to recharge my batteries."


IDIOM: TO RING IN THE NEW YEAR

Idiom: to talk turkey



Meaning: to talk business, to talk in a serious way.

Example: You should stop messing around and talk turkey!



Idiom: to turn into a pumpkin



Meaning: to have to return home or go to bed because it's late

Example: I usually turn into a pumpkin around midnight.

Idiom: to turn over a new leaf

Meaning: to start behaving in a better way

Example: My life is a mess. It's time to turn over a new leaf!

MEANING: TO BE UNGRATEFUL





EXAMPLE: I KNOW THE CAR
YOU RECEIVED IS NOT THE
